## Who is this course for?

- Have an **Intermediate (B1)** level of English or **Upper Intermediate (B2)** level of English

- Would like to **meet people** from other countries in Europe, to set up professional partnerships or personal connections

- Learn by experiencing activities that you can use in your classroom with your students, whatever subject you teach
